City of Santa Cruz Public Safety Initiatives Launched Since July 2013

<u>Prevention Programs and Projects</u>–These programs are designed to prevent crime by encouraging positive activity in public spaces and engaging at-risk youth in supportive programs

- City Awarded \$500,000 grant from the State to install 40 lights and a series of recreation offerings along the San Lorenzo Riverwalk path (from Highway 1 to Kaiser Permanente Arena). Public Works upgraded lighting in the Front Street parking lots, Riverwalk bridges and Kaiser Permanente Arena to brighter and more energy efficient LEDs
- Teen Center increased its service from five to six days a week and extended its hours during summer, school breaks and school minimum days
- Front Street Business Improvement program initiated (environmental design features to reduce loitering and other illegal activity)
- 24-hour public portable restroom installed near Front and Laurel Street

<u>Strategic Enforcement</u>– These efforts are intended to increase the City's ability to enforce municipal and State codes and hold offenders accountable for their actions

- City, County and social service providers partnering to developing a Top 100 Chronic Offender Program, to reduce recidivism amongst top repeat offenders
- Recent lateral hires bring Santa Cruz Police Department within three positions of full staffing (94), with a new academy recruitment underway
- Parks and Recreation added seven Park Ranger positions, to provide seven-day a week maintenance and patrol coverage in City parks and open space

Collaborative Funding- These are safety efforts funded with partner governments and non-profits

- Provide \$80,000 to County for mental health services for highest risk recidivists downtown (MOST Program)
- City Council approved \$20,000 for community youth programs, including \$7,500 to the Santa Cruz Youth City Council
