I, ANDREW MILLS, hereby declare as follows:

- 1. I am the Chief of Police of the Santa Cruz Police Department ("SCPD"), and I have held this position since 2017. I have personal knowledge of the facts recited herein, and, if so called, I would competently testify to the same.
- 2. I previously served as Chief of Police in Eureka, California, from 2013-2017. I served with the San Diego Police Department from 1983-2013 in various ranks and positions, including Lieutenant, Unit Commander, a Commanding Officer, and Captain. From 1977 to 2006, I held various positions and ranks in Michigan and California.
- 3. I am familiar with the real property at issue, San Lorenzo Park along with "the Benchlands" greenbelt. I have personal knowledge of encampment conditions at San Lorenzo Park and have personally made numerous visits to the Park after the Court granted the injunction in this case.
- 4. Since the injunction was granted on January 20, 2021, I am aware of the following serious crimes that have occurred in the Park:
  - Sexual Battery and Assault. On February 10, 2021 a female subject living in San Lorenzo Park reported to SCPD that she was strangled during a sexual battery. The accused suspect in this incident was also living in San Lorenzo Park at the time. (Santa Cruz Police Report No. 21S-00833).
  - Death Report. On February 11, 2021 or February 12, 2021, a woman residing in San Lorenzo Park died of an apparent drug overdose.
  - Robbery and Aggravated Assault. On February 21, 2021 SCPD responded to a fight with weapons at San Lorenzo Park near the duckpond. The victim was located with injuries to his face and said he was struck with a metal pipe. Both the suspect and victim in the incident resided in San Lorenzo Park at the time of the incident. (Santa Cruz Police Report No. 21S-01064).
  - Attempted Murder. On February 24, 2021 SCPD responded to San Lorenzo Park after being
    dispatched to a report of a victim being struck in the head with an object. The victim was located
    suffering from a laceration to the head and was transported to the hospital for treatment. (Santa
    Cruz Police Report No. 21S-01129). SCPD recently arrested the suspect for this crime in San
    Lorenzo Park. The arrestee resided in a hotel adjacent to San Lorenzo Park and often frequented
    the Park.
  - Vandalism. On February 29, 2021 a homeless person with mental health issues residing in and around the park vandalized and broke the windows of cars belonging to the senior citizens

parked in handicap parking spaces near the San Lorenzo Park Apartments on Dakota Ave. (Santa Cruz Police Report No. 21S-00798).

- 5. The number of arrests in and around the San Lorenzo Park area has dramatically increased with the presence of the encampment. The number of arrests in January tripled, from 11 arrests in January 2020, to 33 arrests in January 2021. And the number of arrests nearly doubled in the month of February, from 23 arrests in February 2020, and 41 arrests in February 2021. My observation as Chief of Police is that this increase in arrests is directly related to the encampment located in San Lorenzo Park.
- 6. I continue to receive numerous calls, emails, and personal complaints from community members regarding the open drug use, drug trafficking, and unsanitary conditions related to the encampment at San Lorenzo Park. On January 22, 2021, I met with senior citizens living across the street from the Park who told me they are sleep deprived as a result of people in the park screaming and yelling at all times of the night. The senior citizens are fearful of walking in and through the park as they feel harassed and vulnerable to assault. These individuals need access to the park as the most direct route for access to essential services, the nearby CVS pharmacy, and grocery stores.
- 7. The SCPD has been diligent in attempting to address crime and safety issues at San Lorenzo Park during the injunction period. Specifically, we have increased patrols of the area, thoroughly investigated crimes and complaints in San Lorenzo Park and we have made arrests wherever possible. We have also arranged for CSOs to accompany individuals (mostly senior citizens) who desire an escort to walk through the park. I find it to be truly unfortunate that senior residents need a public safety escort to walk through their neighborhood park.
- 8. Despite the SCPD's diligence in addressing crime and safety issues at San Lorenzo Park, based on my personal observations, discussions with Departmental staff and members of the public, and professional training and experience, it is my professional opinion that conditions at San Lorenzo Park continue to decline with the injunction in place and constitute a public nuisance.
