Good Afternoon All -

Subject: Friday Afternoon Status Update.

I wanted to provide a brief update on the status of issues related to benchlands and other homelessness issues prior to the end of the day and to let you know that I'll be working with Laura Schmidt and Matt Huffaker over the weekend to ensure a smooth transition as I get ready to head out of town on Monday.

Here are the headlines:

- 1. Plans for additional forecasted rain storms beginning Monday have been developed staff have already initiated outreach to those occupying the low-lying area between Branciforte Creek and the San Lorenzo River and those occupying or who reoccupied areas behind the cemetery that they need to be moving to higher ground.
- 2. Steps are being taken today and through the weekend to reduce the potential for trash or other camp related items to end up in the river should water levels rise to the point that they did with Monday's storm.
- 3. If/when storms actually are imminent, additional City staff will be deployed to again advise anyone who hasn't left the at risk areas to leave the area.

Also, to document all of the storm related work completed during the last week, Elizabeth Smith has compiled a chronology documenting the actions taken by City staff to alert those in at risk areas regarding the coming storm and to assist those whose locations were being inundated by the rising river to relocate out of the rain and ultimately to the Depot Park parking lot.

Regarding Depot Park, as I'm sure is the case for all of you, we have been receiving a lot of telephone calls and emails regarding the community's concerns regarding camp that we established there yesterday. We acknowledge the concerns that have been raised, but there is still a lot of unhappiness related to this development. Our key talking points include:

- 1. This camp is not permanent;
- 2. This isn't an "anything goes" camp, and all participants have signed statements acknowledging the rules, which are being actively enforced by City staff; and
- 3. The Council took action this week that will allow staff to start implementing a number of initiatives that have been in the works that will implement shelter and other services in the coming weeks. These initiatives are being implemented as quickly as we possibly can so that individuals from the Depot Park area will be able to relocate to other areas as soon as possible. We're working hard to have at least some of these options available beginning in early January with others coming online through the month.

During the upcoming Holiday Closure, please be assured that City staff will be monitoring and managing conditions and taking appropriate and necessary steps to respond.

Dear Councilmembers,

Please find a detailed chronology of City staff's work over the past week ahead of and in response to the storm attached for your information. Please also find the participant agreement for the Depot Park temporary evacuation site. Below you will find some details expanding on Rosemary's talking points about that site for your conversations with constituents.

Depot Park

- This is a temporary evacuation site.
- Individuals signed agreements to participate. Enforcement of these rules is occurring daily through Homelessness Response Team, Fire and Police oversight.
- Homelessness Response Team staff are onsite every day to meet with individuals at the camp to ensure campers are adhering to the rules and the location is clean.
- The Council took action this week that will allow staff to start implementing a number of initiatives that have been in the works that will implement shelter and other services in the coming weeks. These initiatives are being implemented as quickly as we possibly can so that individuals from the Depot Park area will be able to relocate to other areas as soon as possible. We're working hard to have at least some of these options available beginning in early January with others coming online through the month.
- Staff will continue working to connect these individuals with shelter beds, Homeward Bound, or other County services as they are available.

Flooding Incident | Chronology of Citywide Support

Dec. 10-17, 2021

Friday-Sunday, December 10-12, 2021 | Preparing for the Storm

Fire Department/Emergency Operations closely monitored weather forecasts and reported to staff and leadership about the upcoming storms. During this period, the National Weather Service reported that severe storms would NOT impact the City of Santa Cruz.

To ensure individuals in low-lying areas were aware of the coming rains, Homelessness Response Team members spent eight hours outreaching to people camping in the cemetery and the Benchlands South, encouraging them to seek higher ground and working with them to clean up trash and debris to mitigate materials entering the San Lorenzo River.

Monday, Dec. 13, 2021 | All-Hands Response

Morning

The National Weather Service forecast from 6 a.m. did not predict significant changes in their prior assessment that the storm would primarily hit south of Santa Cruz – in Monterey County. City staff and public safety recognized changing conditions, and an in-person evaluation was conducted by Fire Chief Oatey and Parks and Public Works staff members. Fire consulted with USGS and NWS to get up-to-theminute information. Chief Oatey authorized/requested an immediate evacuation of the cemetery and Benchlands South with this up-to-date, real-time information. The Water team monitored streamflow and weather.

Immediately following the evacuation order, eight staff members, including two Police, three Fire, one Parks, one Water and two Homelessness Response Team employees, conducted camper evacuations along the Flood zones along the San Lorenzo River for up to six hours. Fire's Emergency Services activated the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) "virtually" and reached out to SC County's Office of Resource, Recovery and Response (OR3) for support and supplies. Based on reports from City staff, Emergency Services specifically requested blankets, cots, water, meals-ready-to-eat (MREs), heaters, lighting.

Midday

Five Parking Services staff set up the River Front Garage for evacuees. A senior Parking Services staff member stayed onsite to conduct intake and manage the garage site through 6 p.m. Other staff, including three Homelessness Response Team and five Parks and Recreation employees, worked to evacuate campers and transport campers and their belongings out of Upper San Lorenzo Park over the following four hours. Five additional Parks staff stayed after hours to move portable toilets to the River Street garage emergency shelter.

Emergency Services confirmed with SC County OR3 staff that supplies (blankets, cots, water, MREs) were delivered by County staff around 5 p.m. Emergency Services staff also assisted with setting up a temporary evacuation site located at River St garage. CERT volunteers and City staff distributed supplies as people checked in. Staff began canvassing the County and community partners for alternate evacuation sheltering options with the hope of finding an indoor or other covered location. No sites were able to be secured from that effort. Four individuals with medical vulnerabilities were able to move to the Armory shelter.

Evening

Staff remained onsite at the River Front Garage until 10 p.m. and in the Benchlands/San Lorenzo Park area until after 11 p.m. Five Parks staff were called back to assist public safety personnel by contacting people remaining in Benchlands and moving their belongings to River Front Garage until 10:00 p.m. Police staff was deployed to clear and maintain upper San Lorenzo Park as it is closed after hours. The Fire Department duty chief and additionally staffed units continued to patrol low-lying San Lorenzo River and river mouth/main beach areas. Reports indicate that the river elevated to levels of 20 feet. There were no reports of rescues.

Tuesday, Dec. 14, 2021 | Repair and Recovery

Parks conducted routine maintenance to address litter and debris throughout river and streams (riparian areas). Five Parks and Recreation Wharf/Beach staff members collected debris and litter which had washed up on the beaches and underneath the Wharf for around 5 hours. The team collected 261 needles and executed waste drop-off at the landfill.

The Homelessness Response Team continued staffing River Front Garage with support from Parking, Public Works and Parks and Recreation. The City's contractor for encampment trash removal at the cemetery and the Benchlands began to clear debris and trash as the water receded from low-lying areas. Analysis and planning for near and long-term shelter locations in the City was underway throughout the day. Staff continued canvassing for alternate evacuation sheltering options with the hope of finding an indoor or other covered location.

Wednesday, Dec. 15, 2021 | Repair and Recovery

Parks conducted their routine maintenance to address litter, debris throughout river and streams. Five Parks and Recreation Wharf/Beach staff members collected debris and litter which had washed up on the beaches and underneath the Wharf for around 4 hours with more than 100 needles collected.

The Citywide Encampment Assessment Team met two times to work on the operations and logistics for standing up Depot Park as a secondary emergency evacuation area. The team provided sanitation and hygiene facilities and the plan and resources needed to move people and their belongings from the River Front Garage to the temporary evacuation area at Depot Park. Spaces were drawn in the parking lot, and the infrastructure was put into place. The team developed the participant agreement and voucher for the Depot Park location, which outlined the set of rules that participants will be required to follow

Thursday, Dec. 16, 2021 | Repair, Recovery and Planning

From 8:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m., 15 staff members, including 12 Parks and five Homelessness Response Team employees, set up and moved 40 camps from the River St. garage to Depot Park parking lot. Approx. thirty-five camps had "owners." The remaining five were abandoned at the time of the move. The Encampment Assessment Team met to debrief on the move, coordinate additional logistical needs at Depot Park, and assign duties for meeting those needs. Two Police staff were onsite at Depot Park assisting with the occupancy of the parking lot.

Cleanup and trash removal continued via a City contractor in the Benchlands. Three Parks and Recreation Wharf/Beach staff members collected debris and litter that washed up on the beaches and underneath the Wharf for about 2 hours. They collected 21 needles and executed one dump run.

With storms in the forecast for Monday, Dec. 20, the Citywide Encampment Assessment Team and Fire began planning and preparing for next week. Fire began gathering and reporting forecasts to city staff, updating City/department contact lists for the incident, and developing contingency plans for the City's

population given the inclement weather forecasts. As always, Fire's Emergency Services would activate EOC operations as needed.

Friday, Dec. 17, 2021 | Current Conditions

The River level has subsided, and cleanup efforts continue in the low-lying areas. Approximately 150 people are still in San Lorenzo Park Benchlands. The Benchlands South area and the cemetery have been closed. A Parks staff member with an ATV and another Parks staff member were each cleaning behind the cemetery for three hours today, and the City contractor worked on cleanup at the cemetery camp for six hours today. Approximately 30 cubic yards of refuse were removed from the area, and in addition, a significant amount of metal debris was removed. Police were onsite in the cemetery while cleanup efforts were underway.

Two Homelessness Response Team staff worked to verbally informed individuals in the south Benchlands camp to vacate and were offered assistance with spaces in the north camp. The team estimates that 11 people remain. The Homelessness Response Team also continued its Depot Park temporary emergency shelter management.

The Citywide Encampment Assessment Team and Fire continued planning and preparing for next week. Fire continued gathering and reporting forecasts to City staff and developing contingency plans for inclement weather forecasts. Staff is working to identify an evacuation site for the Benchlands should one be required.

Future

While the team has not had time for a formal debrief, we have evaluated the major areas where operations went smoothly and where the team could have improved. As such, we will be even more conservative in our reliance on forecasts, continue cleanup and more readily require individuals to evacuate low-lying areas.

The City contractor will be at the Benchlands South location Saturday to clear trash and debris. FD/EOC will evaluate NWS forecasts and consult with meteorological and USGS experts daily. They will patrol the river, streams and oceanfront during the storm. They will report forecasts/findings to city staff as needed. If necessary, they will activate our EOC for emergency response to weather-related issues that need to be addressed.

Fire will continue to conduct life safety inspections of the temporary evacuation area at Depot Park. Homelessness Response Team, Fire and Water, should floods be imminent, will continue outreach to camps along San Lorenzo River and warn/advise of incoming weather and potential risks.

The temporary evacuation location is expected to remain active for the next 3-4 weeks. Securing alternate covered or indoor locations have been one of the most significant challenges of this effort and continue to pose challenges in the team's day-to-day homelessness response efforts. Staff will continue to canvass for alternate evacuation sheltering options with the hope of finding an indoor or other covered location.

The City Manager's Office is on point to continue proactive communications with the community and address community concerns. Please check <u>cityofsantacruz.com/homelessness</u> for updates.

Depot Parking Lot Camp Participant Agreement / Camp Rules

| ١, | , (hereinafter "Participant") hereby understand, |

| С | Samp (hereinafter the "Camp"), to follow and adhere to the following: |

- 1) Camp Rules. Participant shall comply with the following key rules:
 - 1. No violent behavior toward yourself or others;
 - 2. No theft;
 - 3. No open drug use;
 - 4. Participants must utilize provided hygiene units, and Participants are strictly prohibited from urinating or defecating in the Camp or the surrounding area;
 - 5. No open fires;
 - 6. No weapons, fireworks, or incendiary devices;
 - 7. No motor vehicles in the Camp;
 - 8. Propane tanks are limited to either one (1) large (20 pound/5 gallons) or two (2) small (16 ounce camping) per campsite;
 - 9. No aggressive behavior, inappropriate sexual comments, offensive/aggressive use of profanity, or the use of profanity around children;
 - 10. No vandalism, misuse, or destruction of property (including fencing electrical boxes, etc.);
 - 11. No damaging trees or any plantings/landscaping;
 - 12. No jeopardizing the safety of any other Camp occupants or staff members;
 - 13. No disorderly conduct on park property, per SCMC 13.08.090;
 - 14. Domesticated pets may be permitted at the City's discretion. Any pet must be leashed at all times while outside of a tent, and pets must not exhibit aggressive behavior. Participants are responsible for taking care of their pets, including but not limited to full clean-up of all pet waste. City reserves the right to require any animal and Participant/pet-owner to leave the Camp. In no event may any Participant possess more than two domesticated pets.
 - 15. Generally, campers' possessions must remain inside their tent, including:
 - a. No belongings are allowed in pathways or open spaces,
 - b. Only one (1) bicycle per camper is allowed,
 - c. No bike parts are allowed outside of camper's tent, and the presence of chop shops is strictly prohibited,
 - d. Encampments are at all times to be maintained in a reasonably tidy fashion, and the accumulation of needles, trash, debris, animal/human waste is strictly prohibited.
 - 16. Participant must respect park quiet hours from 10 pm to 8 am;
 - 17. Participants must interact with City of Santa Cruz ("City") staff, service providers, neighbors, and fellow participants with respect.

Any single violation of these rules may result in the Participant being required to leave the Camp promptly in the City's sole discretion.

- 2) Case Management. Participant agrees to complete an Individual Service Plan (ISP) promptly after Camp enrollment. Participant agrees to meet with City and/or County staff at least once a week to review their ISP.
- 3) Communal Areas. Participant acknowledges that Participant does not have exclusive use or rights over the Camp or any Camp communal areas, and shall share the Camp with other Participants and the City. Participant shall respect all Camp communal areas and keep such areas reasonably clean.
- 4) Camp Meetings. Participant may be required to participate in Camp meetings.
- 5) Enrollment. Participant must be registered to stay at this Camp, and complete the necessary enrollment paperwork. City retains discretion to determine who may stay at the Camp.
- 6) **Temporary Stay.** It is anticipated that the Camp will be operational at this location for less than 4 months. The City has no obligation to operate the Camp, and if the City chooses to cease to operate the Camp, then Participant no longer be permitted to Camp at this location.
- 7) Non-possessory interest. Participant acknowledges and agrees that participation in the Camp does not grant Participant any kind of possessory interest in the Camp premises at issue. Participant acknowledges and agrees that it is not the intent of the City or the Participant for this Agreement to establish any kind of landlord/ tenant relationship between the parties hereto.
- 8) Site Maintenance and Belongings. Participant shall keep all of their belongings within the area assigned by the City. The exterior of each site must be kept reasonably clean and free of excess belongings and refuse. No more than 1 bicycle is permitted per participant. In the sole discretion of City staff, any site that is deemed a health hazard, or that presents a serious risk to the well-being of all community members will be removed and, if appropriate, disposed of immediately. Sites will be inspected at will by City staff. The City may require tents or Participant's belongings to be moved for cleaning or sanitizing purposes.
- 9) Visitors. Only enrolled participants and their guests are allowed on site. Anyone else will be considered a trespasser. Participants are responsible for making their guests aware of, and ensuring that their guests comply with, all Camp rules and expectations. Visitors are not allowed in the Camp common areas during quiet hours (10:00 pm to 8:00 am). Participant is responsible for all actions of their guests.
- **10) Abandoned Sites.** If a site reasonably appears to be abandoned and is not occupied for 72 hours, an abandoned property notice will be posted, and the tent

and all of its belongings may be disposed of. If Participant plans to be away for an extended period of time, Participant must let City staff know, and provisions may be made to assure that belongings are not discarded.

11) Termination. Participant may be asked to leave the Camp for any reason, at any time, in the City's sole discretion. Any violation of the expectations or guidelines in this Agreement may result in the Participant being required to leave the Camp immediately.

Under most circumstances, the City anticipates that this Camp will use a threetier safety plan before participants will be required to permanently exit the Camp:

Tier 1: Participant will be verbally informed of violation of Participant Expectations Agreement.

Tier 2: Assuming the problem persists, a Safety or Corrections Plan will be written. Participant will identify the unsafe behavior and a remedy will be drafted.

Tier 3: If the problem continues to persist, the Participant will be required to promptly leave the Camp.

- **12) Storage of Personal Effects.** In the case of abandonment or eviction, the City may store Participant's personal effects for up to 90 days. Personal effects that remain unclaimed after ninety days may be discarded, recycled, dedicated for public use, or given to a nonprofit agency for charitable use.
- **13) Respect.** Participants are expected to treat both themselves, community members, and their surroundings with respect and dignity at all times.
- 14) Waiver of Liability, Assumption of Risk, and Indemnity

Participant understands, acknowledges, and agrees to follow and abide by all the expectations and rules listed above. Participant furthermore understands and agrees that failure to do so will result in Participant being removed from the Camp and barred from entry onto the Camp premises, in the City's sole discretion.

Participant furthermore, on Participant's own behalf and behalf of Participant's dependents, heirs, successors and/or assigns, expressly agrees to indemnify, discharge, release, and hold harmless the City of Santa Cruz and its officials, officers, agents, contractors, service providers, employees and volunteers (hereinafter the "Indemnified Parties") from and against any and all actions, claims, demands, damages, or liability of whatever nature resulting from or in any way related to Participant's use of Camp facilities or Participant's participation in the Camp and related activities therein.

Participant understands and acknowledges that Participant's participation in the Camp may expose Participant to risk and perils, both anticipated and unanticipated, including

but not limited to, risks of illness, injury, property damage, or death. Participant therefore acknowledges that Participant is voluntarily participating in the Camp with knowledge of any dangers and risks involved. Participant hereby agrees to accept and assume any and all risks, including the risk of injury, illness, property damage, or death. In consideration of being permitted to participate in the Camp, Participant hereby agrees to indemnify, discharge, release and hold harmless the Indemnified Parties from any and all actions, claims, demands, damages, or liability (including attorneys' fees and defense costs) for illness, bodily injury or property damage arising from or in any way related to Participant's use of Camp facilities or Participant's participation in the Camp. Participant further agrees not to assert any claim, institute any suit or other legal process against the City of Santa Cruz, its officers, officials, employees, agents or volunteers for injury, illness, death or property damage resulting from or in any way related to Participant's participation in the Camp or Participant's use of the Camp facilities.

Participant accepts the Camp in its "AS IS, WITH ALL FAULTS" condition. Participant acknowledges and agrees that the City has made no representations as to the condition of the Camp or the suitability or safety of the Camp for any purpose whatsoever.

Participant furthermore understands and agrees that these Participant Expectations and Camp rules may be modified or updated from time-to-time, and that Participant may be required to execute an updated Agreement as a condition of Participant's continued participation in the Camp and use of facilities. Participant acknowledges and agrees that Participant is staying at the Camp free of charge and that Participant is not a tenant of the Camp.

BY SIGNING BELOW, I HEREBY CERTIFY THAT I HAVE CAREFULLY READ THIS AGREEMENT AND FULLY UNDERSTAND ITS CONTENTS. I ACKNOWLEDGE THAT I AM VOLUNTARILY SIGNING MY NAME TO THIS AGREEMENT AND BY DOING SO AM ACCEPTING ITS TERMS AS BINDING UPON MYSELF, MY HEIRS, AGENTS, LEGAL REPRESENTATIVES, AND ASSIGNS. I FURTHER CERTIFY MY UNDERSTANDING THAT THIS AGREEMENT CONSTITUTES A RELEASE OF ALL CLAIMS AGAINST THE CITY OF SANTA CRUZ AND ALL OTHERS NAMED IN THIS AGREEMENT.

Good Afternoon All -

I wanted to provide a brief update on the status of issues related to benchlands and other homelessness issues prior to the end of the day and to let you know that I'll be working with Laura Schmidt and Matt Huffaker over the weekend to ensure a smooth transition as I get ready to head out of town on Monday.

Here are the headlines:

- 1. Plans for additional forecasted rain storms beginning Monday have been developed staff have already initiated outreach to those occupying the low-lying area between Branciforte Creek and the San Lorenzo River and those occupying or who reoccupied areas behind the cemetery that they need to be moving to higher ground.
- 2. Steps are being taken today and through the weekend to reduce the potential for trash or other camp related items to end up in the river should water levels rise to the point that they did with Monday's storm.
- 3. If/when storms actually are imminent, additional City staff will be deployed to again advise anyone who hasn't left the at risk areas to leave the area.

Also, to document all of the storm related work completed during the last week, Elizabeth Smith has compiled a chronology documenting the actions taken by City staff to alert those in at risk areas regarding the coming storm and to assist those whose locations were being inundated by the rising river to relocate out of the rain and ultimately to the Depot Park parking lot.

Regarding Depot Park, as I'm sure is the case for all of you, we have been receiving a lot of telephone calls and emails regarding the community's concerns regarding camp that we established there yesterday. We acknowledge the concerns that have been raised, but there is still a lot of unhappiness related to this development. Our key talking points include:

- 1. This camp is not permanent;
- 2. This isn't an "anything goes" camp, and all participants have signed statements acknowledging the rules, which are being actively enforced by City staff; and
- 3. The Council took action this week that will allow staff to start implementing a number of initiatives that have been in the works that will implement shelter and other services in the coming weeks. These initiatives are being implemented as quickly as we possibly can so that individuals from the Depot Park area will be able to relocate to other areas as soon as possible. We're working hard to have at least some of these options available beginning in early January with others coming online through the month.

During the upcoming Holiday Closure, please be assured that City staff will be monitoring and managing conditions and taking appropriate and necessary steps to respond.

We are expecting rain over the next 6-7 days. Expecting 3-5 inches total, with highest six-hour precipitation rate occurring on Thursday 12/23. After discussing the forecast with Water Dept staff, flooding in low lying areas is **not a concern** as of yet. Interim Chief Oatey will continue to monitor and have FD staff patrol San Lorenzo River encampments over the next 48-72 hours.

Interim Chief Oatey has been working closely with county Office of Response, Recovery and Resilience. They received a supply need list with an estimate of quantities needed earlier today and have committed to help fulfill as much of this order as possible if an evacuation is needed.

Encampment Outreach

Yesterday, Fire, PD and Homelessness Response Team members walked the area behind the Cemetery, Hell's Trail and the Agreement Camp (Benchlands South). During their walk, they identified approximately 36 active camp sites and contacted approximately 20 individuals. On Hell's Trail, the team identified approximately 30 encampments and contacted 14 individuals, advising them of the incoming storm. At the Agreement Camp, they identified approximately 16 active campsites and contacted approximately 7 individuals advising them of the incoming storm.

They informed the individuals of the incoming storm and advised them to vacate the area. There did not appear to be any active effort to leave the area from any of the inhabitants. The Homelessness Response Team members in the Benchlands reported that by the end of the day four sites remained occupied in the lowest-lying southern areas.

Homelessness Response Team members identified two more campers to move to the Armory shelter, and they are expected to move tomorrow.

Cleanup Efforts

Parks and Recreation staff continued their regular cleanup of the beach and river mouth this morning. Each day the team is collecting trash, debris and discarded needles from the sites. The refuse removal contractor who works alongside the Homelessness Response Team worked on trash removal from the cemetery last Friday and Homelessness Response Team members led a volunteer cleanup in the cemetery on Sunday. The contractor continued massive cleanup work in the south end of the Benchlands Monday and today.

Depot Park Temporary Evacuation Site

The Homelessness Response Team, Fire and Police continue oversight of the temporary evacuation site at Depot Park. The team is working with campers to ensure compliance with the agreed upon code of conduct. Parks and Recreation have installed external power access for the campers.

Transitional Community Camp – 1220 River

Opening plans for 1220 River St. are set. Homelessness Response Team members are enrolling participants Dec. 27-28. The infrastructure will be installed on Jan. 3-4 with participant move-in occurring Jan. 6-7.

The new Transitional Community Camp will host up to 35 participants, who will be vetted for their ability to comply with a set of agreements that aim to ensure the healthy, lawful functioning of the camp. The agreements will include abiding by a basic code of conduct, contributing weekly volunteer hours toward the maintenance and functioning of the camp, adhering to quiet hours, and attending regular camp meetings.

Participants will also work with case managers to establish individual goals geared toward stability and self-reliance. They will be required to attend weekly one-on-one case management meetings with staff. Successful participants will be allowed to stay for an initial term of six months. Two, three-month extensions will be allowed if the individual is showing progress toward meeting their individual goals. Conversely, participants will be removed from the camp if they do not live up to the community agreements.

Below is your update for Dec. 22, 2021.

Emergency Preparedness

There has been no significant weather updates to report. Over the last 24 hours, we have received .45" of rain and expect .5"-1" through Friday. The valley will receive 1"-1.5" over the same time period. There is the potential for thunderstorms tomorrow, but, again, no threat of flooding at this time. No forecasted flooding in SLR.

Interim Chief Oatey patrolled the east levee from Soquel to Felker this morning and this evening. There were no immediate flood concerns noted. The water level between Hwy 1 and Soquel bridges actually dropped from this morning to this evening. FD will continue patrols tonight and tomorrow.

Enforcement

Lieutenant Crofts, PO Cole, PO Luna and Interim Chief Escalante conducted a foot patrol behind the cemetery at 9 a.m. with the intention of citing people for being in a closed area. PD issued 8 citations before an individual who was a suspect was contacted. Consent was given to search his backpack. Officers found a BB gun and quickly afterwards found a loaded handgun. He was arrested for those initial charges. A full search of his person and backpack resulted in a total of \$11,211 in cash being found along with (gross weight) 171.7 grams of fentanyl/heroin, 42.9 grams of methamphetamine and other indicia of sales. The large amount of cash, drugs and other items of evidence (over 60 items) took two officers all day to book it. The suspect was medically denied at the Jail because they were concerned he may have swallowed some drugs along with other medical reasons. PO Cole spent all day at the hospital and just cleared the ER at 4 p.m.

The total charges were for a previous warrant, 11351 HS & 11378 HS, 25400 PC (Carrying concealed firearm), 29800 PC (Addict in possession of a firearm), 25850(a) PC (Carrying a loaded firearm in public) and 25850(c)(6) PC (Carrying an unregistered firearm).

Encampment Sites

Homelessness Response Team members will be working through the holiday, checking in on the Benchlands and Depot Park each day.

San Lorenzo Park

Parks and Recreation staff brought portable toilets from River St. garage to San Lorenzo Park and located them near the waste dumpsters near Water St. PD responded to abandoned encampments behind lawn bowling, Parks is cleaning up today and tomorrow. Condition of the Benchlands is wet and muddy. Some individual campers have spread out to other areas including at the base of Branciforte Creek footbridge, under the Soquel St. bridge, and to higher ground on the opposite side of the river.

Depot Park

An electrical panel was installed at Depot Park. A one-way in, one-way out traffic flow was established for access to the Optum COVID testing site co-located in the parking lot. Thanks for Public Works for the assist on this! Sandbags were delivered and are being used by campers.

1220 River Street

Enrollment packets for 1220 are printed and ready for action early next week. The procurement process to purchase shower units with CDBG funds should also begin next week. Parks and Recreation is scheduling for trucks and staff for the eventual move. The Homelessness Response Team purchased gift cards to have the Benchlands environmental stewardship team (BEST) work this Sunday and through the end of January. Thanks to Travis for coordinating!

Hi Wes,

Thanks for chatting with me this afternoon. I've attached the camp rules that we're looking for assistance in enforcing.

For minor issues, we would want a progressive approach – verbal warning, written warning, and finally an eviction notice. For significant issues, like exhibiting violence, we can pursue eviction right away. As discussed, for actual evictions, we can have Police assistance.

The time it will take to go through the camp will vary based on the number of violations present. We have about 35 tents there now. The vast majority are in compliance. I saw about 3-5 questionable ones the last time I was there earlier this week, but the team has been down aiming to keep things consistent with the rules.

A nightly log of those who have received warnings (written or verbal) and photos would be helpful to review patterns of non-compliance.

Thanks again for your assistance. I've copied other City stakeholders here from the Police and City Manager's Office. Feel free to reach out if you have any questions.

Please find the update for Dec. 23 below. Weather conditions are looking good. Unless there are significant changes or issues that you should be aware of, this will be the final update until Monday, Dec. 27.

Emergency Preparedness

The weather forecast hasn't changed much. The forecast shows another .25-.5 inches of rain into late Friday morning. Late Friday, Saturday and through Wednesday of next week, another system will bring scattered showers bringing 1-2.25 inches of rain over that same time period.

Interim Chief Oatey patrolled the east levee from Benchlands south to the cemetery multiple times. 9 a.m., 12 p.m., 3 p.m. and 5 p.m. The river level had mild rise but no flooding threat observed or expected. Camps were wet/soggy with puddling throughout. FD will continue to monitor over the weekend and report any issues.

Enforcement

Police responded to an altercation that resulted in minor stab wounds. The victim is known to PD and was uncooperative with the investigation. He is not a participant in the camp and should not have been onsite at 3 a.m. when the incident occurred.

To support the ongoing work of PD, FD and the Homelessness Response Team at the Depot Park site, the team is onboarding First Alarm to assist in rules enforcement and working to bring on more temporary staff to help manage the various sites while the core team members continue their work on 1220 River St.

Cleanup

Parks and Recreations continued business as usual with routine parks operations, waste pickup, etc.

I ran down to check out the current state of the camp at Depot Park. It's in more need of attention than when I saw it Monday night. I'd estimate 10 spots currently need attention, with varying degrees of challenges - from belongings/shopping carts outside the tent (\sim 7-8) to minor amounts of trash. I expect the amount of time needed will vary - more time up front as more people need to fall in line, and less time later as people understand that we're enforcing the rules.

Thanks for chatting with me this afternoon. I've attached the camp rules that we're looking for assistance in enforcing.

For minor issues, we would want a progressive approach – verbal warning, written warning, and finally an eviction notice. For significant issues, like exhibiting violence, we can pursue eviction right away. As discussed, for actual evictions, we can have Police assistance.

The time it will take to go through the camp will vary based on the number of violations present. We have about 35 tents there now. The vast majority are in compliance. I saw about 3-5 questionable ones the last time I was there earlier this week, but the team has been down aiming to keep things consistent with the rules. A nightly log of those who have received warnings (written or verbal) and photos would be helpful to review patterns of noncompliance.

Dear Councilmembers,

The threat of harm from floods in areas where there are encampments has subsided significantly since your last update. Going forward, updates will come as-needed and, rather than detailed reports of ongoing daily activity, will outline any significant changes in conditions or operations for your awareness. Please find the update for Dec. 27 below.

Emergency Response

Key Points from NWS:

- Rainy, cold, unsettled pattern expected Tonight through Wednesday.
- Minor nuisance flooding possible through Wednesday.
- Rapid rises on streams and creeks possible, but should remain below flood stage.
- Much colder air to move into the region early Tuesday morning and this weekend.
- Low elevation snow may be possible Tuesday, mainly above 1500 feet, but cannot rule out trace amounts in the North and East Bay Valleys.
- Cold air remains in place for much of the work week, with overnight temperatures in the mid to upper 30s for Tuesday through Friday. Colder temperatures in the forecast area wide for Saturday and Sunday.

Interim Chief Oatey patrolled both levees of the SLR during the morning and found the river level to still be 3'-5' below any encampment. He patrolled the same areas in the afternoon and found the water to be down another foot or so below (4'-6') any encampments. There is no expected flooding forecasted in these areas and no advisories or warnings issued for rain or wind.

Over the next two days, the on/off precipitation is forecasted to bring .5"-.75" with no flooding expected in the encampments along the SLR in the city. FD will continue to monitor the SLR encampments and the weather over the next 48-72 hours and report any significant changes as needed.

Enforcement

PD continues to check on both Depot Park and Upper San Lorenzo Park multiple times a day. No signs of any campers in the Upper San Lorenzo Park area. Sunday night PD wrote 20 parking citations in the Harvey West area to address the increase in overnight vehicles.

Encampment Sites

Depot Park

The Homeless Response Team contracted with First Alarm to support rules enforcement at the Depot Park temporary evacuation site. Service began Sunday Morning. First Alarm will be onsite working with the Homelessness Response Team and campers three times per day throughout the remainder of operations at that location.

The Covid testing site at Depot Park continues to operate effectively. The week of Dec 20 – 23 the site conducted 335 tests. The County anticipates increased demand for testing and is considering extending testing hours to 7 a.m.–7 p.m. The testing site currently operates 8 a.m.–4 p.m., Monday-Friday.

Hi Wes, Thanks for chatting with me this afternoon. I've attached the camp rules that we're looking for assistance in enforcing. For minor issues, we would want a progressive approach verbal warning, written warning, and finally an eviction notice. For significant issues, like exhibiting violence, we can pursue eviction right away. As discussed, for actual evictions, we can have Police assistance. The time it will take to go through the camp will vary based on the number of violations present. We have about 35 tents there now. The vast majority are in compliance. I saw about 3-5 questionable ones the last time I was there earlier this week, but the team has been down aiming to keep things consistent with the rules. A nightly log of those who have received warnings (written or verbal) and photos would be helpful to

Dear Councilmembers (bcc'd),

Our need for emergency response related to potential flooding has significantly subsided as we are fortunately facing dry conditions in the next 3-4 days.

Key Weather Highlights:

- Dry conditions are expected through the next 3-4 days.
- Rain is expected to return late Monday 1/3 with showers on and off through Wednesday 1/5.
- No flooding is expected.
- Very cold, near freezing temperatures are expected over the next several nights.

Interim Chief Oatey patrolled both levees of the SLR during the morning and afternoon and found muddy conditions, with puddles and ponding of water, trash and debris. Drier conditions will enable trash clean-up. The river level is approximately 4'-6' from any encampment and no flooding is expected during the next several days.

Enforcement

On Tuesday, PD cited 17 people who were still occupying the area that is closed behind the cemetery. More work needs to be done to clean-up trash in the area, and PD will continue enforcement until the area is cleared. Wednesday night, 18 vehicles were cited in the Harvey West Park neighborhood for illegal parking.

Encampment and Transitional Sites

Benchlands:

- Clean-up efforts from the flood and rains continue, with the City contractor continuing to remove abandoned sites and manage refuse removal.
- Steward staff received a donation of blankets, which are being distributed.

Depot:

- The first patrol by Allied Universal was shifted to 7:00 am to align with the opening of the County COVID testing site, which is co-sited at Depot with the evacuation site. COVID testing hours will be expanded beginning Monday 1/3, from 7:00 am 7:00 pm.
- Allied Universal is distributing garbage bags during their 3 daily patrols of the park.

1220 River:

- The site has been demarcated and pre-inspection approval has been given by Fire.
- Camper enrollment and vetting has been underway since Monday.
- The delivery of the shower trailer will occur on Monday 1/3 and additional infrastructure will be put up early next week.
- Camper move in is schedule for Thursday 1/6 and Friday 1/7.

Staff and I will be in contact over the New Year holiday if needed for emergent situations. Otherwise, we will next update you on Monday 1/3.

Dear Councilmembers,

Storm conditions have fully subsided for now, so this will be the last regular update. We will continue to provide updates as significant milestones are met or activities are underway related to homelessness response.

Emergency Response

The precipitation that was forecasted has been downgraded significantly due to the system moving north of the city of Santa Cruz. We are expected to have light misting/precipitation overnight. The Santa Cruz Mountains are forecasted to receive approximately 0.5"-1" over the next 24-48 hours but there is no flooding expected downstream at this time. The cold weather has also seemed to dissipate as well with temperatures expected to remain in the low to mid 50s. There are no weather-related advisories/warnings issued for the county. FD staff has been in the areas along the SLR (patrols and calls for service) and do not report any major life safety concerns related to weather/flooding.

Cleanup

Parks & Rec operations continue with respect to routine maintenance and waste collection in parks, open spaces, river levee, and beaches. During the month of December 2021, Parks & Rec collected nearly 500 needles at Main Beach. Most of these were located at the river mouth as a result of having been washed downstream from recent rains. This does not include syringes collected by Downtown Streets Team as their aggregated data is not yet available. Nevertheless, this is an enormous number - by comparison in Dec. 2020 there were 50 syringes collected by Parks & Rec staff at Main and Cowell.

Enforcement

PD completed checks throughout the past 24 hours, however, no citations or arrests were made. Multiple abandon tents were tagged for vacate/removal in Benchlands.

Encampment Sites

1220 River St.

The efforts at opening 1220 River later this week are on track (thanks to Megan, Chris, Jer and Public Works). The site has been marked out and reviewed by Fire. Today shower combo trailer was delivered. Wastewater will hook up the unit to sewer, Facilities/Streets will set up large tent tomorrow and Streets will repair cut fence. Move-in of people and belongings will be happening on Thursday-Friday. The team expects about 30 participants, most from the Benchlands, but approximately six from the Depot Park site.

Staff continue to be onsite every day, and the contracted security company (Allied Universal) doing patrols 3 times a day. City staff and security patrols continue to work with campers on rule compliance at the emergency evacuation site. The City and security patrol are meeting again this week to discuss further improving campers' rule compliance and issuance of additional formal violation notices. The Homelessness Response Team is working on a demobilization plan for the location with details to come.

The OptumServe COVID testing site at Depot Park expanded its hours to 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. effective today (1/3) due to increasing demand. This is putting more pressure on Depot Park parking lot as the public is increasingly seeking testing. The last report on volume of tests/samples at Depot Park was from Dec. 27-29 totaling 434 tests.

Meanwhile, we are seeing issues with vehicles parking overnight in the Depot Park parking lot causing traffic jams and limiting access for OptumServe. Public Works plans to address issues with parking in this lot to clear the area and maintain an open, accessible route to the OptumServe site.

Harvey West

Harvey West Pool is open – effective today (1/3) - under the operation of County Parks and Recreation's Simpkins Swim Center staff while the County pool is under renovation. Harvey West will continue to see increased use through the season especially now with the pool open. SCPD is ticketing RVs in the area. It is important that this area remain clear of encampments for safety and accessibility of the park and pool.

<u>Homelessness Weekly Communications Update</u> 1/6/21

Safe-Sleeping, Shelters, and Encampment Management

- We are opening the first Transitional Community Camp at 1220 River today. Tents, hygiene facilities, refuse collection have been put in place and participants are moving in on Thursday and Friday. City staff has been doing to outreach and conducting interviews with prospective participants from existing camps at Benchlands, Cemetery, and Depot Park, and determining who will be a good fit for this program model.
- Continuing to be contact with The Salvation Army to press them on completing the contracting process on their
 end as soon as possible so that we can open the 75 bed shelter at the Armory property. We are pushing them to
 start in early February.
- We have initiated cross-department planning efforts and set tentative timelines for closing encampments at Lot 27, Depot Park, Cemetery, and the Benchlands South Agreement Camp. We expect to close all these areas within the next 30 days.
- Conducted outreach with several community organizations to explore possibilities for adding emergency shelter capacity and/or setting up warming centers during the winter season.
- Working with the County on the 100-Day Encampment Challenge. The official kick-off is this week. City staff
 (Chris & Jeremy) will be facilitating efforts by County Outreach staff to work with people in the Benchlands to
 connect them to services and move them towards better and more permanent housing.
- The County submitted the Encampment Resolution grant on December 31, 2021, City staff had the opportunity to weigh-in on the draft. City Council passed a resolution in support of this grant that, if funded, will provide additional County outreach workers to do targeted case management in encampments along the San Lorenzo River, and will also provide flexible "housing scholarships" that can used to meet a variety of needs and/or remove barriers to people finding housing.

Safe Parking

- Staff is meeting next week to move forward the next steps to establish Tier 2 safe-parking programs.
- The Zone Administrator Hearing for the Coastal Permit related to the Oversize Vehicle Ordinance (and Safe-Parking program operations) was continued to January 12, 2022.

<u>Other</u>

Collaborative meetings between the City & County continue on the plan for utilizing the \$14m from the State.

Mayor and Council (Bcc'd)

In addition to the CM Weekly Report, I will also be pushing out a streamlined "Quick Updates" to the Council and Department Heads only. Have a nice weekend.

Sales Tax Receipts Up 20% Over 2020

Santa Cruz sales receipts for the third quarter of 2021 were 20.2% higher than the third quarter of 2020. After adjusting for modifications, actual sales were up 21.2%, with an overall place of sale collections rising to 25.9%. Most sales categories saw a dramatic increase compared to the lows of 2020 during the height of the pandemic shutdowns.

PD Recruits in the Pipeline

The Police Department is expanding with the newest class of recruits of ten cadets starting the Police Academy this week. We now have a total of 17 cadets making their way through the academy.

\$5M for Affordable Housing

The City of Santa Cruz has been awarded \$5 million through the State Housing and Community Development (HCD) Department's highly competitive grant program, Local Housing Trust Fund (LHTF). These funds have been allocated to the development of the Pacific Station North Project.

Encampment Management

There are 24 people enrolled in the Transitional Community Encampment at 1220 River Street, and we expect to be at full capacity (approximately 30) by the end of next week. Lot 27 was closed this week in advance of a construction project by Soquel Creek Water District. The temporary evacuation site at Depot Park will close early next week. PD issued notices yesterday.

Safe Parking

At the public hearing on Jan. 12, the Zoning Administrator approved the Coastal Permit and Design Permit related to the Oversized Vehicle Ordinance and the Safe-Parking program operation. Staff is moving forward the application and permitting process required by the ordinance. If the approval is appealed to the Coastal Commission, staff will continue work on programmatic elements outside the coastal zone.

Rail Trail Kudos

Our "Westside Rail Trail" has been honored with a 2021 Caltrans Excellence in Transportation Award and an ACEC California 2022 Engineering Excellence Merit Award. Congrats to the team!
